Denise Schantz was honored to be selected as a guardian on the October 2, 2018 Flag City Honor Flight to Washington DC. Her veteran was Lloyd Straub who voluntarily joined the Air Force in May 1949 during the Korea/WWII era. Denise reports that the chemistry between Mr. Straub and herself was immediate and built during the day. The guardian is to see that the veterans needs are met. Mr. Straub didn't want anything special but he was in for a day of surprises. According to Denise, Mr. Straub was a humble man and an unknown hero (just as the rest of our Honored Veterans are).

Veterans Day Around the World

While traveling in New Zealand with Overseas Adventure Travel, we had the opportunity to stop in Hari Hari. Hari Hari is a small rural settlement (population around 350) in the south west of the west coast region of New Zealand's Southwest Island. The name has a Maori meaning "to take/carry joy". Our stop included a delicious lunch prepared by three delightful women from the Returned and Services Association (RSA). The rooms are filled with pictures and other military memorabilia of those that have served. The settlement planted 12 trees for those that did not return from WWII. We were also treated to biscuits from a military themed tin that is part of their fund raising efforts. The luncheon is also another means of receiving a donation. Presently, there is one women veteran from Hari Hari serving in the military. Thanks to our host we did take/carry joy with us as we left Hari Hari.

The RSA mission is to remember and care for all those impacted by service for New Zealand in military operations. The RSA was formed in New Zealand in 1916 by returning Anzacs during World War One to provide support and comfort for service men and women and their families. The Royal New Zealand Returned and Services Association is made up of 182 local RSAs around the country, each an entity in their own right, with over 102,000 members. The RSA believes in a nation joined by a heartfelt connection to the Anzac spirit of courage, commitment, comradeship and compassion. The Flanders Poppy is distributed by the RSA throughout New Zealand to raise money for the health and well being of all service personnel and their families.
