## ODVS Director 2019

Ohio Governor, Mile DeWine has appointed Major General Deborah Ashenhurst (U.S. Army, retired) as the first women veteran Director of the Ohio Department of Veteran Services.

Ms. Ashenhurst began her career in the Ohio National Guard in 1978. She has held assignments at all levels from company, battalion, brigade and Joint Force Headquarters. Ms. Ashenhurst is familiar with operating at a state cabinet level, as she served four years as the Adjutant General and Commander of the State of Ohio.

During her military career, Maj. Gen. Ashenhurst received numerous awards and decorations, including the Army Distinguished Service Medal, Legion of Merit, Meritorious Service Medal (with one Silver and one Bronze Oak Leaf Cluster) and the Joint Service Commendation Medal. She retired from the U.S. Army and the National Guard in October 2015.

Ms. Ashenhurst stated “I am absolutely thrilled to serve our great veterans all across Ohio and do all I can to be a voice and listener, for our veteran community.”



## Band of Sisters: American Women at War in Iraq

“Band of Sisters is a 2007 book by Kirsten Holmstedt about the Iraq War and the women in the military. Band of Sisters presents twelve stories about women on the front line including America’s first women pilot to be shot down and survive, the U.S. military’s first black female combat pilot, a 21 year old turret gunner defending a convoy, two military policewomen in a firefight and a nurse struggling to save lives. Holmstedt claims that women need greater protection from hazing and abuse by fellow soldiers, but that they are as strong as men and should be given full combat roles.”
