The Office of the Ohio Consumers' Counsel (OCC) is the statewide legal representative for consumers in matters related to investor-owned, regulated electric, natural gas, telephone, & water services in Ohio. The OCC advocates for consumers in proceedings before the Public Utilities Commission of Ohio (PUCO), federal regulatory agencies, appellate courts, and the Ohio General Assembly. OCC works hard to keep investor-owned utility prices low, while ensuring safe and reliable utility service, and to educate consumers on important utility issues.

# The Six Triple Eight

Military Women's Memorial writes "in February 1945, the U.S. Army sent 855 black women from the Women's Army Corps (WACs) to England and France to clear the backlog of mail in the European Theater of Operations. The 6888th Central Postal Directory Battalion, known as the Six Triple Eight, was the only all-black female battalion to serve in Europe during WWII. Confronted with racism and sexism from their own leadership and troops, they served with honor and distinction completing their mission in six months. By war's end, the Six Triple Eight had cleared over 17 million pieces of backlogged mail ensuring the troops stayed in touch with their loved ones back home. The last of the women returned home in March 1946."

Its message beckons the visitor to pause in this special place, & with a quiet soul open your heart to allow these plantings to speak; to reflect upon the deeds of those who we owe a debt that can never be fully repaid; & to think about those immutable truths that define us as Americans secured by their full measure of devotion.
