Veteran Directed Care (VDC)

The VDC program provides veterans with opportunities to self-direct their Long-Term Services and Support (LTSS) and continue living independently at home. Eligible veterans manage their own flexible budgets, decide what mix of goods and services best meet their needs.

In general, veterans who have served in active military service and were not dishonorably discharged can be eligible for the program. Furthermore, they need to meet at least one of the following conditions: A clinical need for Home -Based Primary Care (HBPC) services due to chronic or disabling health issues.

For additional information or to start the eligibility process the veteran should speak with their PCP and/or Social Worker at their local VA Clinic, Ann Arbor VAMC or Cleveland Louis Stokes VAMC. Once eligibility has been approved the veteran will be referred to the appropriate Area Office on Aging Person-Centered Counselor.

Everyone who participates in the VDC program will have a Person-Centered Councilor to assist with the management of this program. For example, a Person-Centered Counselor is available to assess your needs and goals, develop a spending plan, evacuate the spending plan, helps with understanding the VDC program and the required paperwork.
